*2 Accident-related insurance benefits are insurance money added to death benefits (general death benefits) and are paid when the insured dies from an unforeseen accident during the policy term.

It is usually stipulated in policy conditions of accident-related insurance benefits riders that insurers may not pay or reduce accident-related insurance money and benefits if the insured is affected by an earthquake; however, all of the life insurers in Japan have agreed to pay the whole amounts without applying the exemption clauses this time.

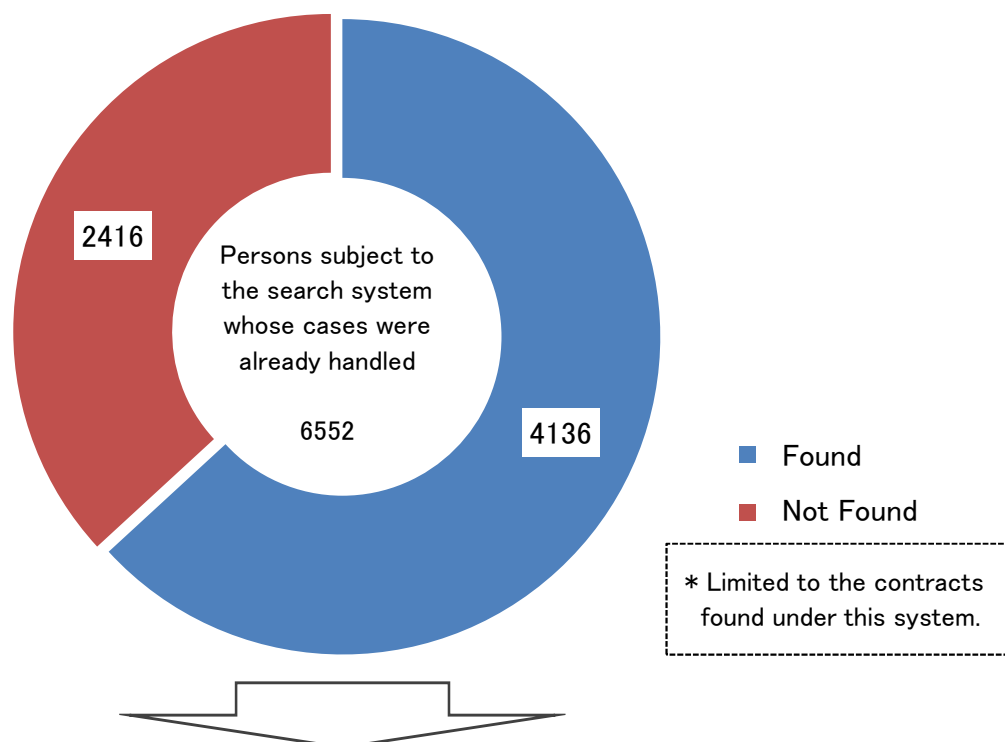

⇒ Among the persons subject to the search system, the number of persons whose contracts were found reached about 63%.
